2005 Town Election Results



Serving his 10th consecutive year (1995-2005) as Mayor of Leonardtown, J. Harry Norris was sworn into office by Evelyn Arnold, Clerk of Court. (It is interesting to note that Mayor Norris also served as the Town's Mayor from 1978-1981.)

Mayor J. Harry Norris and Town Council members J. Maquire (Mock) Mattingly, III and Walter Wise were re-elected in the 2005 Leonardtown elections held on May 3rd. Recent legislation was approved increasing Council terms of service from two years to four years beginning in 2005. To maintain the existing staggeredmembership Council, these three seats will be phased-in this year to serve a three-year term, with their next election slated for 2008.

In 2006, the three Council

member seats currently held by Charles Faunce, Walt Gillette, and Leslie Roberts, will be voted upon to serve four years.

Former Mayor and Town Commissioner Fayrene Mattingly Will Be Missed



Our sympathies are extended to the family of Fayrene Mattingly, who passed on June 10, 2005. Fayrene loved Leonardtown, and was a friend to many. She was a Leonardtown resident and businesswoman, and served as Mayor of Leonardtown between May 1981 and April 1982, and as a Commissioner of Leonardtown between May 1982 and April 1985. Fayrene was instrumental in revitalization and beautification projects of the Town, especially her support of the petitioning efforts to preserve the Court House site on its original grounds in historic Leonardtown.

Mayor's Message

Budget time each year can be a challenging time for the Council and me as we work to continue to provide the quality of services that the residents are accustomed to receiving without major fiscal impact. We are also tasked with the obligation to anticipate and prepare for future needs. I am pleased to report that the Commissioners of Leonardtown Fiscal Year 2006 Budget accomplishes these goals. The Real Property Tax Rate will remain at 15 cents per \$100 of assessed value. As established in 1997, there will be a 2% increase in water and sewer service charges. This annual increase was established to help smooth out spikes in rate increases that were necessary every 5 to 7 years to cover the annual increases in operating expenses.

The budget process begins with the Mayor's proposed budget being submitted to the Council for review. A series of budget work sessions follow, with the Mayor and Town Council refining the document that reflects the direction they feel the Town should take in the coming fiscal year. A public hearing is held to hear comment on the proposed budget. The Council then adopts the proposed budget, by ordinance, with or without amendments.

As we have discussed in previous newsletters, Leonardtown has many development and recreational projects that are quickly becoming reality. I encourage you to stop by the Town Hall and take a look at some of these plans. These projects offer many benefits for existing as well as new residents. We will also face new challenges in the years ahead as we realize this growth. Proper planning and decision making is imperative to maintaining Leonardtown as an exceptional place to live, work and play.

Mosquitoes Will Bite the Hand That Feeds Them!

Summer is here, and mosquitoes are out! The Town provides mosquito spray services for residents and businesses within its corporate limits, in cooperation with the Maryland Department of Agriculture Mosquito Control Program. The program relies on surveys and monitoring of the larval and adult mosquito populations to coordinate control activities. Prevention is the best method of keeping mosquitoes from breeding and biting. To shun from mosquito bites, take the following precautions:

- Avoid outdoor activities at dawn and early evening.
- Wear light-colored, long-sleeved shirts and long pants outdoors.
- Apply insect repellent when going outside, following package instructions.
- Use fine-mesh screen on windows and doors.
- Avoid mosquito-infested areas such as marshes and wetlands.

Mosquitoes can breed in as little as 1/4" of water, and eliminating sites that serve as breeding areas for mosquito larvae is very beneficial. To help reduce mosquito annoyance in your yard and reduce the risk of mosquito-borne diseases, such as the West Nile virus, drain standing water from items such as plant holders, tarps, grill covers, garbage cans, lids, pails, wheelbarrows, etc. You should also change water in birdbaths at least once a week and remove pet food and water from unused dishes. Ditches that contain stagnant water can produce large numbers of mosquitoes and should be reported to the Mosquito Control Office.

Water Conservation

"Together we can conserve

water"! By making simple changes in our daily routines, we can all contribute to protecting this precious resource for future generations:

- Water your lawn early in the morning or at night to avoid excess evaporation.
- Don't over-water your lawn.
- Operate full loads in the dishwasher and clothes washer.
- Turn off water while washing dishes by hand, brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Use a broom, rather than a hose, to clean sidewalks and driveways.
- Use a cover to reduce the loss of water through evaporation on your swimming pool.
- Repair dripping faucets and leaky toilets.
- Keep your shower under 5 minutes.

Trash Pickup and Recycling

Residential trash pickups are scheduled every Tuesday and Friday. Please have your trash in acceptable 30-gallon cans with lids, or cans on wheels. Bagged trash set on the ground is also acceptable. To guarantee collection, trash should be set out by 6:00 AM on the day of pick-up.

The next **quarterly bulk trash** pickup is scheduled for Friday, September 2nd.

Residential recycling pickups of old newspapers, glass bottles, jars, metal and aluminum cans, and approved plastic bottles are made on Thursdays. Waste Management will observe the following holidays, and pickups will run a day behind for those weeks:

- Independence Day, Monday, July 4th.
- Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 5th.
- Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, Nov. 24th.

Water, Sewer and Trash Charges

Beginning July 1, 2005, quarterly residential utility charges are as follows:

Water	\$	51.29
Sewer	\$	76.77
Bay Restoration Fee	\$	7.50
Trash	\$	46.97
	\$ 1	82.53

The trash component increased by \$4.97 per quarter. With the exception of an increase in the landfill tipping fees in January 2004, trash rates have remained the same over the last three years. Water and sewer rates are higher by 2% as prescribed by Leonardtown ordinance. The Bay Fee is unchanged as set by the State of Maryland.

Charges for commercial customers vary by level of service. If you are a commercial customer, you may call the Town office at 301-475-9791 to discuss how the new charges will affect your account.

These new rates will appear on the bill you will receive on September 30, 2005.

With the unusual amount of rain this spring, maintenance of grass and weeds will require a little extra effort this summer. Please remember to check your lot for trimming of grass and bushes so visibility to the street is not being blocked.

What Are Our Residents Asking?

Do I Need a Permit to install a Property Fence? A permit is not normally required for the installation of a fence. However, an environmental permit is required for property in the Critical Area if trees are to be removed. It is advisable to be certain of your property lines by having them marked by a licensed surveyor. It is also a good idea to install a fence a short distance from property lines to avoid ownership disputes and facilitate maintenance. If a Homeowners Association exists in the community, HOA approval is required. Fencing requirements do apply to swimming pools - please contact the Town Office for specifics.

What Home Improvements Require Permits?

Home improvement projects, including sheds, decks, swimming pools, construction of a pier, room additions and additional living space do require a building permit. Town residents should contact Colleen Bonnel, Town Planner at 301-475-9791 to obtain a building permit before making their exciting and new additions!
