An Ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 18 passed by the Commissioners of Leonardtown on February 1, 1939 and to enact a new ordinance to require all hucksters, hawkers, peddlers or street vendors selling any goods, wares, merchandise, products, articles or things within the corporate limits of Leonardtown to obtain a permit from the Commissioners of Leonardtown and providing a penalty for violation of same.

Section 1: Be it enacted and ordained by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that Ordinance No. 18 passed by the Commissioners of Leonardtown on the 1st day of February, 1939 be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

Section 2: Be it further enacted and ordained by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that no huckster, hawker, peddler or street vendor shall be permitted to sell, offer for sale or solicit the sale of any goods, wares, merchandise, products, articles or thing within the Corporate Limits of Leonardtown without first obtaining a permit from the Commissioners of Leonardtown and except at such place or places as may be designated by the Commissioners of Leonardtown. Application for such permit shall be filed with the Secretary for the Commissioners of Leonardtown and shall be accompanied by a fee of \$10.00, which shall be the fee for such permit, provided, however, that residents of Leonardtown selling their own products which have been grown or raised within the Corporate Limits of Leonardtown shall/be required to obtain such permit and to pay such fee. Such permit shall expire twelve months from the date/its issuance and such permit shall designate the place or places within the Corporate Limits of Leonardtown where the huckster, hawker, peddler or street vendor shall be permitted to sell, offer for sale or solicit the sale of any goods, wares, merchandise, products, articles or thing and shall specify the goods, wares, merchandise, products, articles or thing authorized to be sold, offered for sale, or the sale of which is to be solicited.

Section 3: Be it further enacted and ordained that any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than Twenty Five (\$25.00) Dollars and of not more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, or be confined in jail for a period of not more than thirty (30) days, or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the Court.

Section 4: Be it further enacted and ordained by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that this ordinance shall take effect from days from the date of its passage and enactment. Passed and enacted by the Commissioners of Leonardtown, this gth day of Necessher, 1968. R.B. Brong Attest: Souther Lucy
