AN ADDENDUM TO ORDINANCE #49, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF LEONARDTOWN, MARYLAND FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION AND FOR THE REGULATION OF SUCH ACTIVITY

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Leonardtown and Walter Wise, trading as a Disposal Service, mutually desire to extend the terms of the franchise identified as Ordinance #49, and to make certain other amendments thereto,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained and enacted by the Commissioners this **9TH** day of **MARCH**, 1987, that the following amendments be and hereby are adopted and incorporated into Ordinance #49:

- 1. ARTICLE 4, "TERM", is amended to extend the term of the franchise to June 30, 1992.
- 2. ARTICLE 5, SECTION 3, "COMPREHENSIVE LIABILITY INSUR-ANCE", is amended as follows: "Minimum liability limits under the policy or policies (provided by the Grantee), shall be Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) for personal insurance or death and/or damages to property resulting from any (1) occurrence."
  - ARTICLE 6, CONSIDERATION, SECTION 1 "COMPENSATION",
- The parties agree that effective July 1, 1987, compensation of the Grantee shall increase two percent (2%) over the compensation paid for fiscal 1987. Effective July 1, 1988, the rate of compensation shall increase two percent (2%) over the compensation paid for fiscal 1988.
- B. Rate increases for the final three years of the franchise shall be subject to the terms of Article 6, Section 1, as set forth in Ordinance #49.
- C. In the event that the county landfill at any time during the term of this franchise, charges a "dumping fee", Grantee has the right to come back to the Leonardtown Commissioners for coverage of that charge.

eeding/ Commissioner Raley expressed a very real concern about the speeding problem on this street since the new development has opened up and the traffic has increased. He described a very dangerous set of circumstances that includes running stop signs as well as speeding and insisted that something must be done to curb the flagrant violation of the laws, warning that there is going to be a very unfortunate accident if the problems are not resolved. The situation was discussed and it was acknowledged that speed bumps would create problems for emergency vehicles and snow plows and since the existing stop signs are being ignored, it's questionable whether additional stop signs would have any effect. The Commissioners agreed that more intense patrolling of the area by the State Police and/or the Sheriff's Department would probably be the best approach, especially evenings and weekends, as this is the time during which the most blatant disregard for the laws is observed. It was suggested that radar hooked up to an alarm might be an approach to take.



WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Leonardtown and Walter Wise, trading as a Disposal Service, mutually desire to make certain amendments to Ordinance #49,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Commissioners this 8th day of April 1991, that the following amendments be and hereby are adopted and incorporated into Ordinance # 49.

- 1. ARTICLE 3. SECTION 1, "FREQUENCY OF COLLECTIONS", is amended to add the following: The Grantee and Grantor may select up to four (4) days per year as bulk trash collection days. These four days will be in addition to the normal collection schedule. These days shall be set aside to collect materials that are not ordinarily and customarily hauled away.
- 2. ARTICLE 6, SECTION 1, "COMPENSATION", is amended to add the following: The Grantee is entitled to compensation for the bulk trash collection days as set forth in this amendment. Such compensation will be in addition to the compensation paid for the normal collection schedule. The Grantee and Grantor shall agree on an hourly fee which will also be subject to the annual rate review as set forth in Article 6 Section 1 of Ordinance # 49.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED AND ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect April 8, 1991.
