Resolution for Updated Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan

WHEREAS, St. Mary's County is vulnerable to natural hazards such as coastal erosion flooding, extreme weather conditions, and wildfires that can result in property loss, loss of life, economic hardship and threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Leonardtown adopted the St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in 2006 by Resolution number 1-06 and on February 12, 2018 the Commissioners of Leonardtown adopted the update of the plan by Resolution 1-18;

WHEREAS, the proposed updated St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan recommends mitigation measures that will reduce losses to life and property affected by the natural hazards that face the County; and

WHEREAS, the updated St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan was reviewed by the Maryland Emergency Management Agency on December 14, 2022 and the Federal Emergency Management Agency on February 14, 2023; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED on this 13th day of March, 2023, by the Commissioners of Leonardtown that:

• The 2022 St. Mary's County Multi-Jurisdictional Updated Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Town of Leonardtown.
