At Home in Leonardtown featuring **"First Friday" Celebrations in Leonardtown**

"First Fridays" are celebrated by scores of cities and towns nationwide as a successful means in promoting arts, entertainment, and businesses within the heart of many towns and neighborhoods. The idea is to mutually benefit the businesses by granting more visibility to their establishments, while the community enjoys an evening of customer specials, artist receptions, and entertainment. The North End Gallery launched the "First Friday" concept in Leonardtown over 20 years ago by featuring monthly artisan receptions on Saturdays. During a meeting of the Leonardtown Business Association a few years ago, a member suggested broadening those monthly receptions to include downtown restaurants, shops, and musical entertainment during the warmer months. Thus, "Summer Nights on Fenwick Street" were born, held on Friday evenings, and were a hit! This was the perfect audition that enhanced the Association's mission of promoting Leonardtown's livelihood, growth, and vibrancy. Following the success of "Summer Nights on Fenwick Street", in 2006 Leonardtown expanded the series and launched its own "First Friday" paradigm.

Today, "First Friday" celebrations are held in Leonardtown every month, year-round between 5:00 PM-8:00 PM. The event has expanded to include not only Historical downtown Leonardtown, but outlying areas as well, including Breton Market Place, The Maryland Antiques Center Complex, the Shops at Breton Bay, and the College of Southern Maryland.

There's even a "First Friday" committee that markets and coordinates the activities and entertainment for the public's enjoyment. Committee members agree that "First Friday" activities "opens the doors to Leonardtown." To highlight the "First Friday" of each month, Historic Leonardtown's art galleries, restaurants, cafe's, antique shops, bookstores, and specialty shops stay open later and come together to offer live bands, music, artisan receptions, fine dining, wine tastings, and customer discounts. Leonardtown art galleries host special receptions and feature creative works of selected artisans. Our restaurants often prepare extraordinary



St. Mary's Ryken Ribbon Cutting

On June 15, 2009 St. Mary's Ryken High School officials held a ribbon cutting to mark the start of Phase One of the school's Master Plan. Phase One includes a 1,000 seat stadium with a 6 lane track and synthetic turf field. In 2009 the school property was annexed into the Town of Leonardtown allowing the Master Plan to move forward. President Mary Joy Hurlburt, who spearheaded the effort, states "This is a project not only for our students, but also for our local community. We have a tradition of providing an excellent, college preparatory education in Southern Maryland and it was time for us to address the future needs of our school. After many years of work by our administrators, faculty, parents, alumni, friends and Board of Directors, our campus is getting its first significant reshaping since the Xaverian Brothers established the school in 1956. Our students are looking forward to the new stadium, which will place us on par with our counterparts in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) and will give our track and field team the chance to have home meets for the first time in a long while."

Going Green "Planet Aid" Clothes Collection **Development Program**

Have you seen those yellow "Planet Aid" collection boxes that have been placed in various areas around St. Mary's County and questioned their purpose? This quote from the "Planet Aid" website explains it well: "We collect and recycle used clothing and shoes in 19 states in the USA. Items donated to "Planet Aid" are resold and proceeds are used to support education, community development and HIV/ AIDS programs in Africa, Asia and Latin America. We partner with individuals, schools, organizations, companies and government agencies to inform about and contribute to community based development."

Collection areas in St. Mary's County include the K-Mart parking lot in California, the Oceanic Gas Station in Charlotte Hall, the Patuxent River Naval Air Station Recycling Center, and the St. Mary's County's six convenience centers. Any kind of clean, dry clothing is acceptable. Shoes should be tied or securely fastened together. Stuffed animals, cloth dolls, sheets, towels, tablecloths, napkins, hats, gloves, belts and purses are also acceptable.

Highlights of the Town FY 2010 Approved Budget

On or about September 30th, utility customers will receive the first quarterly bill for fiscal year 2010. On June 16, 2009, the Town Council approved revised rates for water, sewer and trash services.

Residential sewer rates will increase from \$92.10 to \$93.70 per guarter, and water rates will increase from \$43.04 to \$43.90 per quarter. Trash service charges will remain the same.

Water charges for commercial customers are based on actual metered usage. The water rates for commercial customers were also increased by 2%. The sewer rate for commercial customers is \$93.70 per equivalent dwelling unit.

Trash Pickup and Recycling Reminders

Residential trash is collected every Tuesday and Friday. Trash is accepted in 30-gallon cans with lids, cans on wheels, or toters issued by Goode Trash Removal. To guarantee collection, trash should be set out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. on the day of pick-up.

The next quarterly **bulk trash** pickup date will be Friday, September 4th. Bulk trash will be collected at the same time as your regular trash, so please ensure all your items are placed at the curb together.

Residential recycling is collected every Wednesday. To guarantee collection, your recycling tote should be set out the night before or by 6:00 a.m. the day of pick-up. With streamlined recycling, it's easier than ever to recycle! 
