

The Commissioners of Leonardtown and the Leonardtown Business Association in partnership with the St. Mary's Arts Council and James LePore Productions proudly announced the creation of the 1st Annual Leonardtown Summer Music Festival in May of this year.

This exciting new Festival combined the Leonardtown Summer Concert Series and the Downtown Tunes Concert Series into one amazing festival featuring great artists like Six Gun South, The Ryan Forrester Band, Wesley Spangler, Robbie Boothe and more!



In a season full of highlights, there are a few evenings that were special standouts during the Festival: First was the Jazz Era Concert/Kickoff Party for the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Potomac Jazz & Seafood Festival held on Friday, July 12. It was an exceptional evening that celebrated jazz throughout the ages. The Chesapeake Swingband delighted the crowd with popular jazz selections from the 20's, 30's 40's and 50s; Ballet Caliente gave an exciting, roaring 20's performance; and the Classic, Antique Car Show courtesy of the St. Mary's Rod & Classic Car Club featured cars from the eras being highlighted. Attendees got in the act by dressing in attire from their favorite




period from the 20's - 50's and posing with the cars from their chosen time period. There was a costume contest with a \$500 cash prize sponsored by the Escape Rooms of Southern Maryland. The winners of the contest were a Mother-Daughter Team, Grace and Heather Hahn,

who dressed as Rosie the Riveters from the 1940's. Grace and Heather's handmade costumes were a hit at the event as were the 1950's Candy Girls, two volunteers from the Summer Youth Volunteer Program (SYV), India Taylor and Khiya Milne. The SYV

"Candy Girls" helped raise \$256 in donations for the Leonardtown Volunteer Fire Department during the event. The youth volunteers were so popular that people continued to ask for the "Candy Girls" after they changed back into their regular clothing. The fun then continued Friday night with jazz after parties at The Rex, Olde Town Pub and Social Coffeehouse, at the main event on St. Clements Island on Saturday, July 13, and then ended on a high note on Sunday, July 14 with jazz-themed events and activities throughout Historic Leonardtown that included Jazz Brunches, Art Shows, Live Music, a Jazz Era Movie Screening and Cocktail Party and more at various venues throughout Town. It was a wonderful weekend celebration of all things Jazz.

Another memorable event took place on the evening of Friday, August 16 when Olde Towne Insurance sponsored an added concert at the Port of Leonardtown Winery featuring Leonardo Garcia y Son Horizonte at the Salsa & Sangria Party. There was an overwhelming response to the event with the online ticket sales quickly selling out (additional tickets were added to meet the interest). #### Mayor's Message

The history of Leonardtown Wharf is long and colorful. Redevelopment of the site as we know it today began in 2001. The Town received a \$104,000 Community Legacy Grant to clean up the long-abandoned buildings and pilings. From there the effort became a true partnership between the Town, State of Maryland, St. Mary's County and RAR Associates.

Today the waterfront park is a vibrant, thriving gathering place for residents and visitors, young and old. This month construction of the floating dock for transient boat traffic has started with plans for completion in late Fall. The Town is extremely fortunate to be part owner of a 400-acre farm adjacent to the Wharf and the downtown, known as Tudor Hall Farm. There is a huge opportunity to expand and grow not only the downtown core but also the public waterfront. There are few public access points to the water in St. Mary's County even though we have over 500 miles of shoreline on the Patuxent River, Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay.

How this property and the waterfront is planned and developed is one of the most important decisions for the future of Leonardtown. In 2006 we began the planning of the waterfront with a consultant, Crozier and Associates, and added to the plan in 2012. Today there are new opportunities, which will only present themselves once, and we will work to get it right! In addition to the Downtown Strategic Plan, approved in February 2019, we are working closely with the private owner of the Tudor Hall Farm property and the St. Mary's County Economic Development team to chart a course for the expanded waterfront and downtown core. These are exciting times for Leonardtown and the future is bright.

### Trash and Recycling Information



Bulk Trash Pickup - Bulk trash pickup always falls on the first Thursday or Friday (depending on your regular pickup day) of March, June, September and December. So, the next quarterly bulk trash pickup dates will be September 5 & 6 and December 5 & 6, 2019.

Holiday Pickup - Thanksgiving on Thursday and Christmas on a Wednesday, so for those weeks slide your pickup day one day forward. For example, trash pickup scheduled for Monday will slide forward to Tuesday and so on for that week. Recyclables will also slide forward on those weeks and be picked up on Thursday, except for Thanksgiving when recycling will be picked up on the regular day -Wednesday. #### Façade Improvement Grant

The Town received a \$50,000 grant from Dept. of Housing and Community Development for the purpose of regranting to downtown businesses to make façade improvements. The grant is a matching grant and has been awarded to 14 different businesses in \$5,000 or less grants. We have already seen some of the projects start and look forward to watching the improvements being completed.



#### Downtown Strategic Plan Update



Consultants from Mahan Rykiel Associates and Arnett Muldrow, who lead the recent Downtown Strategic Plan update, returned to Leonardtown on August 28 - 30. A series of roundtable discussions, with over 70 participants, explored ideas for updating the Leonardtown branding, establishing a plan for

wayfinding signage and planning for some alley network improvements. All of these topics came from recommendations in the Downtown Plan. Additionally, the implementation of freshening the landscaping in the Square, adding shade trees and creating gathering spaces for day to day use of the Square are underway.

The consultants will return to roll out the new Leonardtown brand identity in October. These meetings are open to the public and will be held at 4:00 p.m. on October 21 at the Town Council monthly meeting and 8:30 a.m. on October 22 for a special LBA meeting. Both meetings will take place at Town Hall. Please join us for this exciting revelation!

#### Executive Inn and Suites Under New Ownership

#### Residential Water and Sewer Rates Effective July 1, 2019

Town residential customers are billed for their water and sewer use based on their metered water consumption. Meters are read and customers are billed on a calendar quarter basis. The rates are as follows:

#### WATER

Minimum charge: \$30.60 per quarter; includes 1 to 10,000 gallons of water.

Extra consumption: \$ 2.55 for each thousand gallons, or fraction thereof, over 10,000 gallons.

#### **SEWER**

Minimum charge: \$67.74 per quarter; includes 1 to 10,000 gallons.

Extra consumption: **\$6.77** for each thousand gallons, or fraction thereof, over 10,000 gallons to a maximum sewer charge of \$155.75.

Bay Restoration Fee: \$15.00 per quarter

## **Residential Trash/Recycling Service:** \$66.18 per quarter

Per Town Code, all residents are required to utilize the Town Contractor for the trash and recycling service.

The **minimum** bill for water, sewer (up to 10,000 gallons) and trash service will be \$179.52.

We now offer On-Line Bill Pay through our website at <a href="www.leonardtown.somd.com">www.leonardtown.somd.com</a>. Find the link on the front page that is labeled "Pay Utility Bill On-Line", and follow the steps.

Also, available in the Town Hall Office is a Credit/Debit Card ONLY Kiosk for your convenience.



North End Gallery celebrates 33 years in business! In September 1986, North End Gallery was created by two women - Sally Carter and Pat Lewis - who wanted local artists to work together to showcase their art in a true gallery setting. They recruited 20 local artist friends and established an art cooperative in which every member

would have equal say and equal responsibility in running their art gallery business.

After ten years, the group grew to 35 artists and needed more exhibit space. They found exactly what they needed in Historic Leonardtown - a former dress shop at 41652 Fenwick Street that had been vacant for years. They repaired, remodeled and painted the walls and installed moulding, track lighting and new carpeting. They bought glass jewelry display cases and had custom pedestals built to display the pottery and sculpture. After a few years one of the members, Judith Coville Conrad purchased the building to secure it for the artists' gallery and just as importantly to become an anchor business in Leonardtown's Arts & Entertainment District.

#### Deputy's Corner

- Can request package pick up from the USPS –meaning if the packages are brought to the post office for delivery, they will be left at the post office for you to pick up.

# Town Hall News

#### Sewer Backup Prevention

Taking notice of what is flushed down toilets and sinks can prevent most backups. The materials listed below (or similar items) should never be flushed down toilets or drains. These items can clog your grinder pump, sewer line and the Town's sewer main, causing damage to your property and the other properties connected to the main.

When you use your toilet, shower, dishwasher or washing machine, waste water leaves your home through pipes that connect to the Town sewer system. Many materials frequently flushed or poured down the drain can harm the pipes that connect to the Town sewer system. Every property owner connected to the Town sewer system can be a potential contributor to sewer problems. Putting the wrong items down the drain can damage the sewer system, cause sewer backups in your home, and sewer releases to the environment.

The only thing you should ever flush down a toilet is human waste (urine and feces) and toilet paper. Please keep in mind. products that are labeled as flushable are not sewer friendly and should not be flushed. Here is a list of some things to keep out of the toilet:

- Disposable diapers and baby wipes
- Feminine products
- Facial tissue
- Makeup removal pads
- Cleaning wipes of any kind

- Fibrous materials, such as cotton balls, swabs, cigarette butts, animal and human hair
- Unused medications
- Live seeds, beans and peas (they can sprout)
- Large quantities of cereal, grains, or dry beans
- Coffee grounds
- Disposable hand towels and mechanic's shop towels
- Carpet fiber
- Plastic, metal, wood, etc.

Another culprit that causes blocked sewer pipes is grease. Never pour grease in your sink drain. When grease washes down the sink, it sticks to the insides of the pipes that connect your home to the Town's sewer. It also coats the insides of the Town's sewer pipes. Eventually, the grease will build up and can completely block sewer pipes. That can create difficult and expensive maintenance problems for both the Town and private property owners.

To prevent sewer backups and blockages, please be mindful of what items you are flushing down your toilets and pouring into your sink drains.
